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Home Learning for week beginning 18th January 2021

This week we are continuing with The Gingerbread Man birds and their nests as well as our feelings.

Activities for you to carry out.

1. Use your small world figures such as your dolls, superheroes, dolls house, Lego figures to help you to retell the story of The Gingerbread Man. Challenge yourself to change the story.
2. Have a look around your house, using what you find, this could be your Lego bricks, the cushions from your sofa, some cardboard tubes or tins from your cupboard, make a bridge for the Gingerbread man to cross the stream. Did your bridge stay standing? Was it wide enough to cross the steam? How else could you make a bridge?
3. Go and look at yourself in a mirror. How do you feel today? Are you feeling happy or sad?
4. Using your paint or crayons, draw/paint a picture of your face. Challenge yourself to paint a picture of Mummy or daddy. Are they feeling happy or sad? What makes you feel happy? Sing the song "If you're happy and you know it."
5. In winter bird nests often fall down from the trees and leave nowhere for the birds to rest or lay their eggs. Go on a walk, collect twigs and sticks, feathers and grass, and use these to make your own birds nest. Listen to the story of Mole and Baby Bird being read by your teacher. Have a think about how the bird feels but also how mole feels at the end of the story.
6. Counting. Have a go at counting your spoons? Count your big spoons and your small spoons. How many big spoons do you have? 1,2,3,4,or 5? Do you have more big spoons or more little spoons?

Have fun singing the “Speckled Frog” song, not only is it focusing on number but also rhyme.

Group Times

1. PSED. We are reading the story “Colour Monster”, in the book the monster has many different feelings. These feelings are represented by colours. Yellow is for happy, blue is sad, red is angry, green is calm and grey is worried. Have a think about how you are feeling? What colour are you today? Listen to the story being read to you by your teacher.
2. Maths. In nursery, we are still busy counting out groups of objects. We really like playing a game where we have to use our hands to grab a handful of objects from a large group on the floor. Find 6 small objects such as buttons, beads, and cotton wool balls. Count out six before using your hand to grab/take a handful. How many did you grab? This group time is supporting you and helping you with your one to one counting.
3. Phonics. This week we are going to play a rhyming game. Watch your teacher as they play the game. Now it is your turn. Find a bowl and some objects that rhyme, this means that they sound the same. You could use a can, a pan, a van, a man etc. Put them on the floor and as you sing the song put an object into the bowl. Have fun as you make your silly rhyming soup.
