At Basnett Street we aim to provide a welcoming, safe environment in which children are provided with exciting, stimulating and multi-sensory 'hands on' learning experiences, that meet the needs and interests of all our children.

Basnett Street is a maintained nursery school run by the local authority. We aim to provide flexible provision to meet all individual needs and can offer 30 hour funded places and more working in partnership with The Chatterbox Club. The Chatterbox Club is an extended provision of the school and can access full day care for children from 2 years. It can also offer the 2 year old government funded 15 hour places if you meet the eligibility criteria. 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Basnett Street Nursery School and The Chatterbox Club aim to provide a flexible provision subject to availability enabling children to be able to access full days from 7:45am to 5.45pm with a Breakfast Club from 7.45-8.45am, Lunch Club from 11:45-12:40pm and After-School Club from 3.40-5.45pm.

A packed lunch is required at lunch time, and a light tea is provided for the After-School Club.

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Early Years Foundation Stage

We follow the Early Years Foundation Stage for all the children ages 0 - 4 years. This framework underpins everything we aim to achieve at Basnett Street Nursery School and The Chatterbox Club. Play is the foundation for all of a child's learning and development. Through play we provide opportunities for your child to learn and develop in all areas of the curriculum which are:

Evidence of your child's learning and achievements such as observations, photographs and artwork will be filed in their learning journal. Staff, in partnership with parents, use these journals to help them plan interesting and exciting activities which support children's development.

You are welcome to look at your child's learning journal at any time, your comments are most valued.







We strongly recognise the importance of parents working in partnership with us to support their child's learning; we recognise that as parents/carers you are your child's first educators, so it is important that you feel valued and are involved in your child's development and education. We have an open door policy, which means that you can speak to us anytime regarding your child or any other queries you may have.



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Induction Process







It is important that your child settles well into our school and The Chatterbox Club. We follow a flexible induction period adapted to your child's needs. All children will be allocated a key worker and they will work closely with you to plan your child's induction.

Children must be brought and collected by a responsible adult. Children will not be allowed home with anybody under the age of 16 years. Please always inform staff of any adult other than yourself who will be collecting your child, who is not named on the parental permission slip.

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School Information

Basnett Street Nursery School and The Chatterbox Club Fund



For all children receiving the free early years entitlement funding (15 free sessions), there is a voluntary contribution of £2.50 per week or 50p per session for those children in Chatterbox not accessing the full 5 days. This is collected in nursery school and The Chatterbox Club every week. We rely very heavily on this money to fund a wide range of exciting activities such as baking, malleable play, toys/resources, parties and other special events on offer to your children. These charges are separate to the Chatterbox Club's session charges.

Library



Each week your child will bring a book bag, reading journal and book home for you to read together and you can then use the reading journal to let us know whether you enjoyed the story or not. Do not feel you have to write a comment, a smiley face or a sad face will do in the comment box if you so wish. You can keep the book for a week and then return in your child's book bag.

Accidents and Illnesses



All staff are Paediatric First Aid qualified with Gillian Burnie also First Aid trained. Parents/carers are requested to provide emergency contact numbers in case the nursery school and the chatterbox club need to contact you. If your child becomes unwell during the session or if your child suffers from an accident which requires home or hospital treatment we will use the numbers provided to make contact with you. We are able to give your child prescribed medicines if your child suffers from a specific medical condition. These should be provided in the original packaging, named and dated and with full written instructions. Please see your child's keyworker for more information.

Parking



In order to ensure the safety of our children and families, we would like to remind you **NOT TO PARK** or wait **ON THE YELLOW LINES** outside the building. This has been identified as a hazard by parents and staff. Therefore it is important that the school is fully supported with this issue, in order to ensure all our children and parents have a safe journey to and from school.











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What to Wear



Our Uniform

School Trends high quality school wear is now available for purchase directly from school. All the garments offer excellent value for money and are made from hard wearing, machine washable fabrics, specially decorated with our school logo. Our school uniform is not compulsory but one is available if you would prefer this option .Suitable shoes must be worn. The uniform consists of a Jade Cardigan £11.00 or Jade Sweatshirt £9.50 and a Amber Polo Shirt £7.50.

Outdoor Clothes

Our weather cannot be relied upon even in the summer, please make sure your child has a jumper and a coat with them. Wet weather suits will be provided in wet weather.

Labelling

Please make sure that all items of clothing are clearly labelled with your child's name. This helps us to locate any missing clothing quickly.

Ordering

Sweatshirts, cardigans and polo shirts can be purchased through the school office, please compete an order form and drop it into school with the full payment.

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Outdoor Play

Your child will have access to the outdoor play area every day. We provide rain coats, waterproof trousers and wellies.

It is important that you provide your child with outdoor clothing that is suitable for the weather depending on the time of year. It would be helpful if you could provide your child with a spare bag of clothes.

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Complaints Procedure

We aim to have staff available to ensure that parents/carers can discuss any issues of concern so as to avoid unnecessary distress.

Parents/Carers may in the first instance take any complaint to the Headteacher of the nursery school Lindsay Ingham or the manager of The Chatterbox Club, Grace Walker We will always give serious consideration to concerns and complaints that are brought to the schools attention. We will ensure that the concern/complaint is dealt with effectively and with fairness to all parties. Where possible we will always try to resolve complaints informally.

If we feel that the complaint regarding the nursery school can not be resolved informally we will follow Lancashire County Council's formal complaints procedures (if you would like a copy of this please see the Headteacher). If we feel that the complaint regarding The Chatterbox Club cannot be resolved informally, the concern/complaint will need to be put in writing to the Chairman of the Management Committee, using the Chatterbox Club address.
